



"When Covid arrived, I spotted an online activity called "Writing Compelling Non-Fiction" and pondered whether it might improve my style and scope of expression. I took the plunge and joined the Group. At school, I had been good at Maths and Science, but I dreaded the essays I was compelled to produce for English and History. The English master tried hard, but eventually he gave up! Thenceforth, I was 'raised' as a scientist and allowed to neglect the humanities.

That all began a slow change when I found myself in the Civil Service, having to draft technical reports and briefs for busy people. I was made Secretary of a senior committee, and had to learn – on the job – how to capture what the top–men meant to say, rather than what they did say. The online group has between four and eight, meeting monthly to present and discuss an exercise proposed by Group Leader Sandra. I have made new acquaintances and, under Sandra's expert eye, improved my word power and confidence."
